Recipe of the week is: Sunshine Muffins

These muffins are fun to prepare and use up tons of ingredients in your fridge and are versatile! The recipe was inspired by muffins from Fraiche Living. They freeze great!

#### Ingredients:

- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour (if you don't have sub with all purpose)
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon and 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup toasted chopped walnuts or pecans (optional)
- 3/4 cup canola or olive oil
- 1/2 cup maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs, well-beaten
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup grated raw beets or zucchini, peeled (optional if you don't like it leave it out)
- 1 cup grated raw carrots, peeled
- 1/2 cup grated apple or pear (skin left on)
- 1 1/2 cups frozen blueberries or raisins (optional)

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375F and line a 12-cup muffin tin with paper liners
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together the oats, whole wheat flour, all-purpose flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, salt and nuts. Whisk together to combine.
- 3. In a separate medium bowl, combine the oil, maple syrup, vanilla, eggs, milk, beets, carrots, apple.
- 4. Stir the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients, folding until incorporated (do not over mix).
- 5. Fold in the frozen blueberries, divide the batter among the muffin tins, and bake until they are golden brown around the edges and a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean, about 30-35 minutes. Place on a cooling rack and store at room temperature in a covered container for up to 5 days or in the freezer for up to 1 month. *Enjoy!*

On Thursday, April 25, the grade 2 and 5/6 classes went on a field study to Windermere Creek. As part of the FINS program, the students walked down to the creek and met with Scott Cope (biologist), Jon Bisset, Olivia Boyer and Shelley Tardif to study our local stream habitat. After learning about the safety equipment needed to study in the field (fast moving creeks), the students were able to learn about the amazing creatures that live in our water. Students saw various stages of mayflies, stoneflies, and caddisflies. The biggest excitement of the day was finding a very large dragonfly nymph! After seeing how many species live in our creek, students now understand how important they are to the food chain.
