With the low-maintenance bee boxes, our school can partake in beekeeping without the traditional upkeep. Recipe of the week is: Banana, Bran and Blueberry Sheet Pan "Muffins"

These are a super fun way of making muffins. They are baked in 9x13" pan and then cut into squares. The kids didn't find my square muffin joke as funny as I did! Haha

Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1 ½ cups wheat bran
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup buttermilk
- 1/2 cup canola oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs, well-beaten
- 1 ripe banana, mashed with a fork
- 1/2 cup frozen blueberries or raisins (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375F and grease a 9X13" glass pan.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together the flour, wheat bran, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Whisk together to combine.
- 3. In a separate medium bowl, combine the oil, brown sugar, vanilla, eggs, and banana.
- Stir the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients, folding until incorporated (do not over mix).
- 5. Fold in the frozen blueberries, pour the batter into the 9x13" pan.
- 6. Bake until it is golden brown around the edges and a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean, about 20-22 minutes. Place on a cooling rack and store at room temperature in a covered container for up to 5 days or in the freezer for up to 1 month.




