Dear Windermere Elementary Families,

It's hard to believe we've arrived at the final newsletter of the school year. As we wrap up another incredible year at Windermere, I want to take a moment to express my heartfelt thanks to you—our dedicated parents, caregivers, and families. Your support, encouragement, and partnership have made a tremendous difference in the lives of our students and in the strength of our school community.

This marks the end of my fourth year as Principal of WES, and I continue to be amazed and inspired by the children we serve. I've said it before and I'll say it again: Windermere students are truly some of the best I've ever had the joy of working with. And I'd be remiss not to extend that same praise to all of you our parents and caregivers—who stand beside them every step of the way.

As we look back on the year, we also have much to celebrate. Our students have made incredible academic progress, and we are proud to share just a few high-lights:

- Writing: In the fall, 54% of our 1st–3rd grade students were not yet writing at grade level. By spring, that number decreased significantly to just 24%— a huge step forward!
- Math (SNAP Assessment): In October, 48% of students reached the highest level of numeracy. By spring, that number soared to 70%.
- Reading: In October, 41% of primary students were identified as emerging readers. By May, that percentage dropped to just 14%, showing strong growth toward proficiency.

These results are a testament to the dedication of our educators, the resilience of our students, and the unwavering support from families like yours.

Thank you once again for being such an important part of our Windermere community. We wish you a safe, relaxing, and joyful summer. We can't wait to see our students back in the fall—recharged and ready for another great year!


